

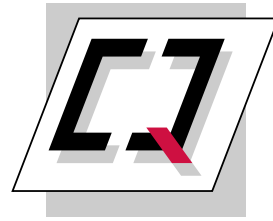
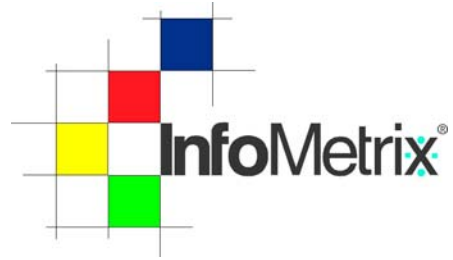


D.L. Massart Award in Chemometrics

1. Since 2006, the Belgian Chemometrics Society (BCS) grants every two years the D.L. Massart Award in Chemometrics, amounting to 2500 Euro.
2. The competition for the D. L. Massart Award in Chemometrics is open to PhD students worldwide who present their PhD thesis in the two years leading up to the bi-annual symposium of the BCS
3. Both theoretical and applied developments in chemometrics are eligible for the award, in areas such as experimental design, multivariate calibration, statistical process control, process analytics, method validation...
4. A jury appointed by the BCS will evaluate the applications. If no suitable candidate can be identified, the BCS can decide not to grant the award.
5. The winner of the D. L. Massart Award in Chemometrics will be invited to present his/her work at the BCS symposium that follows the selection procedure and his/her expenses made to attend the symposium will be paid for by the BCS.
6. The D.L. Massart Award in Chemometrics 2008 will be granted to a PhD student in chemometrics who has presented or will present his/her PhD thesis between April 2006 and March 2008.
7. Applications for the D. L. Massart Award in Chemometrics 2008 have to be submitted to the BCS by March 1, 2008 to the address given on the application form.
8. The award ceremony for the D. L. Massart Award in Chemometrics 2008 will take place during the BCS symposium to be held on April 11, 2008 at the Vrije Universiteit Brussel.
